The guideline is directed towards researchers, health care providers, and administrators who are implementing standardized nursing language, evaluating clinical information systems, or involved in constructing or using a clinical documentation system for effectiveness research. It results most directly from the authors experiences during a funded NINR/AHRQ research study that required the use of several large electronic data repositories that included standardized nursing data. The guideline content includes the identification of research questions, factors to consider in selecting database variables for analysis, data definitions of clinical variables, potential data sources, methods of requesting data, developing a relational database and a large section on data analysis, plus much more. They describe each of the nursing courses and include student examples of assignments for each course that integrate the standardized languages. <p>NIC Interventions & NOC Outcomes Linked to the OASIS Information Set This 83-page monograph provides linkages based on expert opinion between the data required by the most recent OASIS tool (August, 2000) and the 2000 editions of standardized nursing classifications developed at the University of Iowa, NIC (nursing treatments) and NOC (client outcomes). The linkages are presented as a possible starting place for agencies considering expanded documentation of home health nursing practice to include standardized nursing language.</p>	<p>\$25</p>

The questionnaires can be used to identify the frequency with which NIC interventions are performed and NOC outcomes that should be available on unit-specific information systems. The questionnaires could also be used by faculty to determine which interventions and outcomes should be taught in specific courses. Provided on a 3.5" disk (IBM format), as Microsoft Word for Windows documents. The electronic version facilitates construction of other questionnaires.</p>	<p>\$25</p>
