Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Training Program
Monday – Friday, June 18-22, 2012

The Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) workshop is an intensive five-day course to familiarize registered nurses with all aspects of the forensic and health care processes for sexual assault victims. This course, taught by experts in the areas of forensic nursing, law enforcement, advocacy and criminal prosecution, emphasizes the overall importance of the role of the SANE and their role in the interdisciplinary Sexual Assault Response Team (SART).

Participants will learn to apply the nursing process for the medical and forensic evaluation of patients who have experienced sexual assault. Nurse enrollees will participate in a simulated forensic history, demonstrate speculum insertion on a live patient model and practice expert witness testimony in a mock trial as a part of the educational training. The nurse participant will have a beginning understanding of the issues and complexities of the SANE role.

Lead faculty for the course will be Linda Ledray, PhD, RN, FAAN, a certified SANE. Dr. Ledray is a nationally recognized expert and pioneer in the area of forensic nursing. The program is supported by an array of interdisciplinary expert faculty with expertise in supporting SANE training.

Preconference reading and homework will be sent with confirmation of participation. This is a required portion of the training. Homework will be collected on the first day.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the offering participants should be able to:

1. Describe the role of various health care, law enforcement and criminal prosecution personnel in working with sexual assault victims.
2. Discuss legal and medical standards for the collection of evidence from a sexual assault survivor.
3. Examine sources of victim support and advocacy including crime victim compensation for sexual assault survivors.
4. Conduct a nursing history for a sexual assault patient.
5. Examine laws and legal processes pertinent to SANE practice including participation in a mock trial.
6. Discuss the psychosocial effects of trauma on victims and caregivers.
7. Demonstrate beginning competency in doing a speculum exam on a live patient model.
